Second BRiSE Conference on Early Childhood Development
Berlin, Germany, June 19–20, 2023

After the stimulating inaugural conference and the unfortunate break of our series the *Bremen Initiative to Foster Early Childhood Development* (BRiSE) is now pleased to cordially invite you to attend the Second BRiSE Conference on Early Childhood Development. It will again be held as an in-person single-session meeting at the Leibniz Headquarters in Berlin, Germany. The two-day conference is scheduled for June 19th–20th, 2023.

The BRiSE research alliance particularly focusses on disadvantaged families. Its aim is to foster insights on how to counteract the emergence of cognitive and social disparities in early childhood development. Therefore, our conferences bring up to 100 academics of all career stages invested in Early Childhood Education and Care (ECEC) to share their most recent findings and engage in interdisciplinary dialogue. With this call we request submissions for paper presentation or poster presentation in both German and English. We welcome submissions from all disciplines engaged in research on early childhood development. Please indicate which type of contribution you would like to make in your submission. The summaries of accepted papers will be made available online.

We ask everyone intending to participate to register for the meeting. There will, however, be no registration fee.
